



# The Barry Vivian Walking Group Program – April, 2026

**Please note: Walks this month start at 6.30am**

## Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup> April

### Chermside Hills & Cabbage Tree Creek

**Meet at the McDowall Shopping Centre, Hamilton Rd, (just off Beckett Rd).** Walk through Chermside Hills to Cabbage Tree Creek. Return upstream along the creek to Hamilton Rd. Morning tea/coffee at Deja Bru in the shopping centre. About 6 km, some hills, flat along the creek, some roads, bush tracks, & bike paths, reasonably easy. *[At the Shed this morning: Normal activities, then **Pub lunch at Gaythorne RSL (12.30pm)**. Back well before then.]*

## Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> April

### Samford Valley Walk

**Meet near the museum in Station St, Samford.** A walk near the South Pine River, and along various back roads and laneways in the Samford Valley. Morning tea/coffee at the Samford Patisserie in Samford. About 9 km, a few small hills, urban roads, bush tracks, and laneways, moderate in view of its longish distance. *[At the Shed this morning: **Shed Talk – Peter Spraggon with ‘A Short Review of Rare Earths’ (10.30am – 12 noon)**. Will be back well before then.]*

## Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> April

### Banks St Reserve to Dorrington Park

**Meet in Quandong St, Ashgrove (in parkland adjacent to No. 45).** Follow the Enoggera Creek bikeway westward to Dorrington Park before turning at Wardell St and following surrounding streets back towards Banks St Reserve. Circumnavigate the reserve before returning to Gerbino's (near the start) for morning tea/coffee. About 6km, bike paths, bush tracks, and some urban roads. Mostly flat along the creek but quite hilly in the reserve - reasonably easy to moderate. *[At the Shed this morning: **Shed BBQ (10.30 – 12.00)** Should be back well before then.]*

## Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> April

### Toowong Cemetery

**Meet at the Bowman Park car park off Simpsons Road, Bardon.** Walk to and around the Toowong Cemetery for some of Brisbane's early history. Return to Bowman Park. Morning tea/coffee at Bardon Thyme. About 7.5 km, some hills, urban roads, bush track, and laneways, reasonably easy to moderate. *[At the Shed this morning: Normal shed activities.]*
